“Oh, we are sorry to surprise you! I am Sam and this is my brother Kit. We have come to visit you to learn about Kenya!”



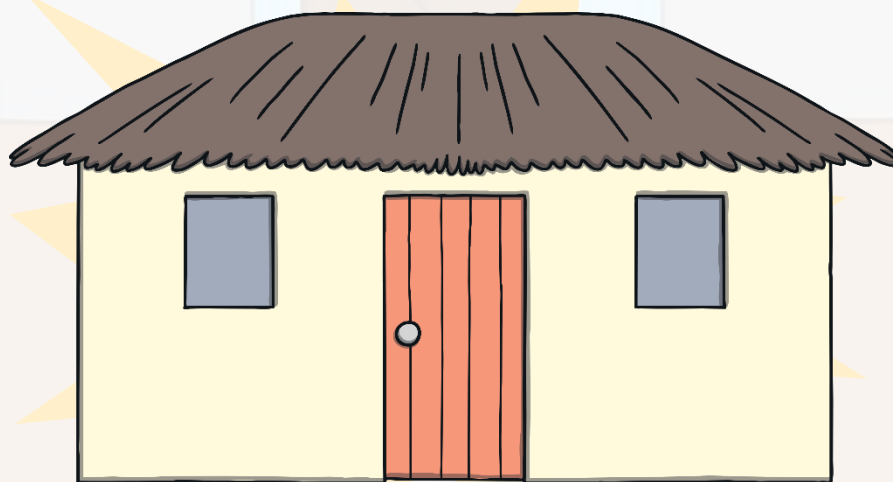
“Oh wonderful!” replied Otesha. “What do you want to learn?”

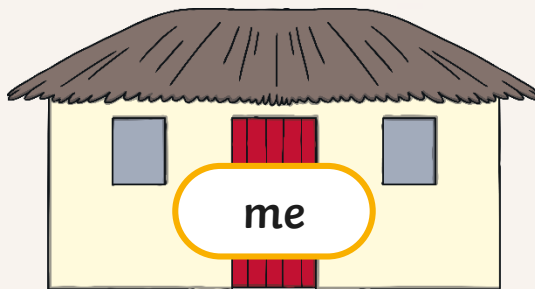
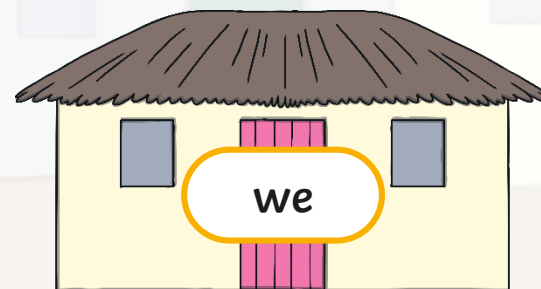
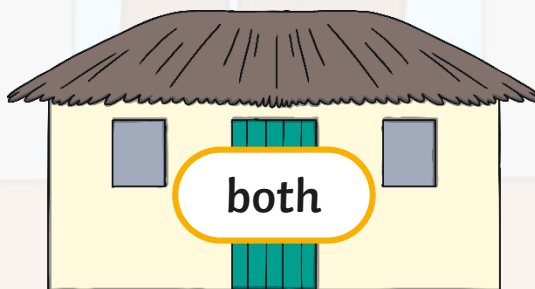
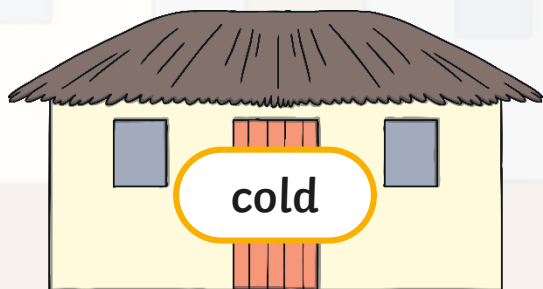
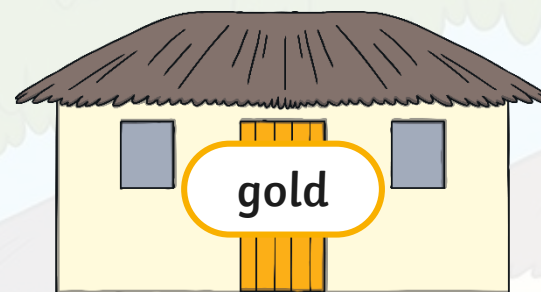
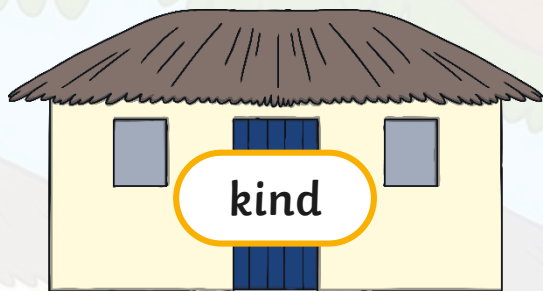
“Everything!” bubbled Kit with excitement. “Where are the animals?”

Read the sentence and click 'Show' to reveal the answer.




What **wild** animals can
